I am excited to inform you all that our 2014 Forum will be held in Chattanooga, Tennessee, hosted by the UT Chattanooga Music Department. The dates will be Feb. 20 - 22. I am still working on the availability of specific ensembles, and will communicate those details later. I am hoping to raise enough money through grants to be able to invite a professional ensemble to do a mini-residency during the Forum; this effort is under way. Most likely, the call for scores will be set for September or October, to give adequate time for score review and repertoire choices. Details for the Salop-Slates Competition will go out earlier as well, with a due date of late November.

In addition to the excellent performance by trombonists William Mann and Adam Dixon and pianist Ling-Ling Chen of Ken's /Crossroads/ at the SCL at Morehead State University the first weekend in March, Ken's SATB choir work /Who Shall Separate Us From The Love Of Christ?/ and his /If Any Man Serve Me /(voice & piano) were performed that same weekend (March 1-2, 2013) at the Christian Fellowship of Art Music Composers held at Mississippi College in Clinton, MS. His wife Judy Davies, also a member for SCL had the privilege to represent Ken by attending the CFAMC conference in his absence.

Ken has also been selected by the Mississippi Music Teacher's Association (MMTA) as this year's commissioned composer.

Ken and Judy Davies have presented our /Poetic Soundscapes/ CD in live performance at four Coastal locations: Eagles Nest as USM Gulf Coast, the Pascagoula Senior Center, MS Gulf Coast Community College Jackson County and the Gulf Coast Writer's Assoc. /Poetic Soundscapes /includes 17 of my poems with Ken's orchestrally crafted music to create a perfect music and sound design combination. It isn't often that a composer has a poet whose words he can use to enhance his musical creations and it isn't often that a poet is blessed to have her own composer easily at hand to compose music to accompany her poetry, so this project has been a really fun joint creative endeavor.

Kenyon Wilson's \*Recursion\*, a seven-part rondo for trombone septet, received joint premieres last month by seven ensembles in seven states. Involved were trombone choirs from the University of South Carolina, Morehead State University, the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, the University of Southern Mississippi, Mercer University, the University of North Dakota, and the University of Alabama at Birmingham. It will receive an additional performance by the Carolina Trombone Collective at the 2013 International Trombone Festival.

Jonathan McNair had two works selected for performance at the SCI Region IV conference, which will take place in October, 2013, at Eastern Kentucky University; and had a work selected for the CMS National conference, November 2013.

#### **Terry Vosbein**

Terry Vosbein is on the tail end of a year long road trip, composing as he goes. One completed work from this sojourn received its world premiere at Carnegie Hall on 22 May. "Charleston Episodes" was a commission from Chamber Music Charleston, who performed the work in New York City, followed by a repeat performance at the Piccolo Spoleto Festival In Charleston, South Carolina. Also created during these 25,000+ miles of driving was a violin/piano suite and a work for traditional British Brass Band. Premieres of these works will take place during the 2013-2014 concert season.

## Laurent Estoppey

Swiss composer and saxophonist Laurent Estoppey, now established in Greensboro NC, pursues his career on both sides of the ocean.

Estoppey premiered his new piece S/L/I/C/E/S for saxophone and live electronics on May 10th in a new series of pluri-discplinary concerts he is organising with Nicholas Rich at Empire Books in Greensboro named COLLAPSS. The series will continue on August 23rd. His piece The challenge of the whale for saxophone quartet, eight new animals after St. Saens Carnival of the Animals was premiered in Switzerland by Marquis de Saxe on April 28 and performed twice more since then. More performances of the piece are going to happen throughout the year.

Estoppey has also just won a grant from Guilford County Art Council for a release on LP vinyl of saxophone solo pieces with electronics, a collaborative work with Greensboro visual artist Tristin Miller.He also put out a brand new website, with many sounds, images and videos : <u>www.laurentestoppey.com</u>

Betty Wishart's Kohinoor Sonata was performed on two different programs this spring. Pianist Margaret Mills first performed the sonata on a concert featuring "American Men and Women Composers of the 20th-21st Centuries". On March 20th Ms. Mills performed Sonata on a lecture recital of American Women Composers at Campbell University. Sonata II was premiered by pianist Jesse Davis on a concert of "Living American Composers" at Campbell University on March 21st. Davis also performed Sonata II at the Cape Fear New Music Festival at Methodist University on April 6th. Wishart's piece was one of five selected for performance from a field of one hundred ten submissions.

James Chaudoir premiered Wishart's Suite of Miniatures for alto recorder at the SCI Conference at Clarke University in Dubuque, Iowa on April 13th. On June 4thSonata II will be performed on the NACUSA concert at Christ and St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in New York City.
