Greetings to all SCL composers!

Our 2020 Southeastern Composer's League (SCL) Forum is a little over a month away and will be held at Jackson State University on April 24-25, 2020. David Mahloch will be our gracious host.

We need a host for the 2021 Southeastern Composers League Forum. And so, those of you who can, should indicate that to me as soon as possible. For those possibly interested in hosting and have never hosted an SCL Forum before, the minimum requirements/expectations are:

1. Secure an appropriate performance venue at your institution.

2. Provide a forum schedule/itinerary, including concerts, programs for each concert and a meeting time and place for the SCL business meeting.

The forum host is expected and strongly encouraged to provide small ensembles and/or solo performers for participating composers to have their works performed; however, this is not an absolute requirement.

The host is also expected to create a call for scores. In that call for scores, please give reasonable time to receive the scores, in order to allow performers ample time to prepare for the upcoming performances.

The host institution will receive \$1,000 stipend from SCL to assist with all related expenses.

Finally, there is a fee for membership in SCL (\$40) as well as a fee for attending the 2020

The TSU Wind Ensemble will also be performing it on their Annual African-American Composer Concert on February 27, 2020 at TSU and for the Historically Black Colleges and Universities Band Symposium on March 18, 2020 in Atlanta, GA. *Necrology/The Mission* will also be performed by the University of Nebraska Symphonic Band on March 10, 2020 for their Spring Concert, University of Nebraska, Lincoln, NE.

Thriving Three (2014) for string quartet and percussion was performed by the Belmont University New Music Ensemble on December 2, 2019 for their Fall Concert, Belmont University, Nashville, TN.

A Fraternal Prelude (1997) for band/wind ensemble was performed by the University of North Carolina Wind Ensemble on February 19, 2020 for their Celebration of Black History Month program, Chapel Hill, NC.

Jonathan McNair's string quartet *All a-Cryin'* is the subject of a short film produced by colleagues in the UTC Communication Dept., which will be screened for the third time on Feb. 24 in Chattanooga. The music also gave rise to a new "spoken word" poem by Marcus Ellsworth, which is included in the film, and led in part to the formation of a debate team focused on 14th Amendment rights. His *Circus of* Dreams for solo flute and metal bowls will be the subject of a presentation at the College Music Society Southern Chapter conference in Nashville, on Feb. 28. *In memoriam* for violin and piano (or clarinet and piano) was performed twice in the Fall, along with *Gratitude* for violin and piano, *Remembrance* for horn and piano, and a setting of *Let Evening Come* for voice and piano.
